SYNOPSIS

Chicago, 1968. As a city and the nation are poised on the brink of violent political upheaval, suburban housewife Joy leads an ordinary life with her husband and daughter. When Joy's pregnancy leads to a life-threatening condition, she must navigate a medical establishment unwilling to help. Her journey to find a solution to an impossible situation leads her to the "Janes," a clandestine organization of women who provide Joy with a safer alternative — and in the process, change her life.

Carol screenwriter Phyllis Nagy takes the reins as director and executes a riveting narrative, partially based on true events surrounding the Jane Collective, who provided thousands of abortions during a four-year period through their covert and precise mobilization. Supported by an impressive cast, Elizabeth Banks delivers a remarkable lead performance as Joy, whose determination and strength of character holds relevance more than a half-century later. Call Jane poses urgent questions about systemic barriers, the ever-shifting nature of politics, and the struggle for women to maintain control of their bodies.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

When Robbie Brenner sent me the script for CALL JANE, I knew that I had to direct it, but also knew that I had to fear directing it. Holding fear and fearlessness close always would keep me honest, I felt. And it did.

My impulse was to create a piece that allowed for each character's point of view to thrive and be communicated without moral judgment but with the kind of messy, complex, and contradictory behaviors that encourage empathy in audiences. No lectures welcome. Subtext, humor and above all—the belief that the political is always personal—guided my development of the script, and ultimately, those convictions held from page to screen.

Telling this story through the point of view of an ordinary woman who finds herself in rather extraordinary circumstances and denied all personal choice at a critical time guided my year of careful reshaping and crafting of an already fine script to reflect an intensely political narrative that doesn't take place in a political arena, per se, but which scene by scene shifts the idea of what a political arena is—or could be.

Exploring the sobering and painful factual history of choice in America while honoring the remarkable contributions of women like the "Janes" also demanded a careful tone, while at the same time recognizing that fact and truth sometimes are mutually exclusive.

Through it all, I never wavered in my belief that serious material is best served with a light touch—inviting people to join a conversation requires that you offer a conversation in the first place. You can't hold that conversation without being a good listener, and you can't listen while you're bludgeoning your audience into submission.

How to communicate a strong filmmaking point of view without insisting that your audience hold that same point of view was why I ultimately pushed forward with CALL JANE.

Holding myself to honesty meant that I had to examine my own beliefs and feelings about the various narrative situations that CALL JANE presents— abortion, race, women's rights and how far we've come—or not come. And in doing so, I concluded that above all, CALL JANE is a meditation on choice—personal, political, transactional, familial—and that it could be nothing else for me but a constantly evolving debate, that I sincerely hope we will be having long past the film's release.

ABOUT THE CAST

ELIZABETH BANKS ('JOY')

Elizabeth Banks's career as an actress, producer, writer, and director continues to flourish with another prolific year ahead. She is known for roles in both comedy and drama as well as film and television. With stand-out performances in projects including THE HUNGER GAMES franchise, LOVE & MERCY, and THE LEGO MOVIE, Banks is also a three-time Emmy nominee for her recurring roles in 30 ROCK and MODERN FAMILY.

Up next, Banks will be seen starring in the feature drama CALL JANE, alongside Sigourney Weaver and directed by Phyllis Nagy. Banks recently wrapped production on Universal Pictures' COCAINE BEAR (which she produced and directed), a character-driven thriller inspired by true events that took place in Kentucky in 1985. She was recently seen starring in the Emmy-nominated Limited Series MRS. AMERICA as 'Jill Ruckelshaus,' streaming on FX/Hulu.

In 2019, Banks wrote, directed, appeared in, and produced CHARLIE'S ANGELS, also under the Brownstone banner. She lent her voice again to 'Wyldstyle' in THE LEGO MOVIE 2: THE SECOND PART, the sequel to the 2014 box-office hit THE LEGO MOVIE opposite Chris Pratt. The first film grossed more than \$469 million world-wide.

In 2015, Banks returned to her popular role as 'Effie Trinket' in THE HUNGER GAMES: MOCKINGJAY – PART 2. She also appeared in a cameo role in MAGIC MIKE XXL, in the Netflix reprisal of WET HOT AMERICAN SUMMER, and hosted NBC's SATURDAY NIGHT LIVE. In 2014, she received critical acclaim for her role as 'Melinda Wilson' in LOVE & MERCY, opposite Paul Dano and John Cusack, who both portrayed 'Brian Wilson.' The film premiered at the Toronto Film Festival and was directed by Bill Pohlad. She also starred opposite Chris Pine in the drama PEOPLE LIKE US, in the independent drama EVERY SECRET THING written by Nicole Holofcener, in the drama LITTLE ACCIDENTS, and in the comedy WALK OF SHAME.

Banks's feature credits include W, in which Banks garnered critical-acclaim for her role as 'First Lady Laura Bush;' her breakthrough role in the Academy Award winning film SEABISCUIT, in which she starred as 'Marcela Howard' opposite Tobey Maguire and Jeff Bridges; Haim Seban's POWER RANGERS, Steven Spielberg's CATCH ME IF YOU CAN, MAGIC MIKE XXL, OUR IDIOT BROTHER, THE DETAILS, ZACK AND MIRI MAKE A PORNO, WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU'RE EXPECTING, MAN ON A LEDGE, THE NEXT THREE DAYS, ROLE MODELS, MEET DAVE, INVINCIBLE, THE 40-YEAR-OLD VIRGIN, FRED CLAUS, SISTERS, SLITHER, WALK OF SHAME, HEIGHTS, THE BAXTER, THE TRADE, ORDINARY SINNER, THE UNINVITED, DALTRY CALHOUN, SEXUAL LIFE, John Singleton's SHAFT, Columbia Pictures' three blockbuster hit franchise SPIDER-MAN as journalist 'Betty Brant,' and the cult hit WET HOT AMERICAN SUMMER.

On the small screen, Banks earned three Emmy Award nominations for 'Outstanding Guest Actress in a Comedy Series' for her performance as 'Avery Jessup' on 30 ROCK and her guest appearances as 'Sal' on ABC's MODERN FAMILY. She also appeared in a recurring role as 'Dr. Kim Porter' on NBC's SCRUBS. Banks reprised her role as 'Lindsay' in Netflix's WET HOT AMERICAN SUMMER: FIRST DAY OF CAMP and WET HOT AMERICAN SUMMER: 10 YEARS LATER. Her theater credits include many roles in American Conservatory Theatre productions, as well as the Guthrie Theater's production of SUMMER & SMOKE directed by David Esbjornson. In 2006 Banks played 'Cherie,' the female lead in William Inge's comedy as part of the Williamstown Theater Festival. Banks also hosts the hit ABC reboot of PRESS YOUR LUCK.

On the production side, Banks made her directorial debut in 2015 with PITCH PERFECT 2 which was the highest opening weekend for a musical in history, the biggest opener for a first-time feature film director, and the second-largest opening for a female director. It also garnered her the 'Breakthrough Filmmaker of the year' award at the 2015 CinemaCon Awards. She made her commercial debut directing a 2017 Superbowl television ad for detergent brand Persil. Also in 2017, Banks starred in and produced PITCH PERFECT 3. She produced the PITCH PERFECT franchise through her production company Brownstone Productions, along with her husband Max Handelman. With an exclusive television deal at Warner Bros. Television and first-look film deal at Universal, Elizabeth Banks and Max Handelman's Brownstone Productions' slate currently includes multiple film, television and digital collaborations across various networks and studios, including Universal, Sony Pictures, Lionsgate, FOX, Freeform, HBO Max, Netflix, Hulu and Peacock. The current film slate includes COCAINE BEAR starring Keri Russell, THE GRACE YEAR, SCIENCE FAIR, THE PAPERPAG PRINCESS, UNCANNY VALLEY and THE MAGIC SCHOOL BUS® at Universal Pictures; INTERNATIONAL SWEETHEARTS OF RHYTHM at

Sony Pictures; MISS CONCEPTION at Screen Gems; BOTTOMS at MGM's Orion Pictures; and WHERE THE FORE ARE WE? with David Wain at Amazon. On the television side, Brownstone produced the critically-acclaimed series SHRILL at Hulu. Upcoming television projects include RED QUEEN and the PITCH PERFECT spinoff starring Adam Devine at Peacock; OVER MY DEAD BODY at HBO Max; and the adult comedy animated series BEDROCK at FOX, with Banks voicing the role of 'Pebbles.'

Originally from Massachusetts, Banks received her Bachelor's Degree from the University of Pennsylvania and her Graduate Degree at the American Conservatory Theater. She is involved with many charities including the Center for Reproductive Rights (where she leads the Center's Creative Council), LA's Best, Temple Israel of Hollywood, Planned Parenthood, The First Lady's Reach Higher Initiative, Heifer International, Intrepid Fallen Heroes Fund, and Turnaround Arts. She currently resides in Los Angeles.

SIGOURNEY WEAVER ('VIRGINIA')

Academy Award nominated and BAFTA and Golden Globe winning actress Sigourney Weaver has created a host of memorable characters, both dramatic and comic, on stage and in film. Her work in over sixty films includes the *Alien* movies, *Gorillas in the Mist, Working Girl, The Ice Storm, Prayers for Bobby, Avatar, My Salinger Year*, and *The Good House*. On stage, she has starred in Tony Award-winning play *Vanya and Sonia and Masha and Spike* alongside David Hyde Pierce and Kristine Nielsen as well as in works by David Rabe, A.R. Gurney and many others. Her television work includes "The Defenders," "Political Animals," "Planet Earth," "Years of Living Dangerously," and the hit French comedy "Call My Agent." Upcoming projects include drama film *Call Jane* alongside Elizabeth Banks and Kate Mara, Amazon Studio's drama series *The Lost Flowers of Alice Hart*, and Paul Schrader's *Master Gardener*, opposite Joel Edgerton. Ms. Weaver is a graduate of Stanford University and holds an MFA from the Yale School of Drama.

Ms. Weaver was very proud to receive the GLAAD Media Award for her work in *Prayers for Bobby* as well as the Trevor Life Award in 2011. She has been the Honorary Chair for the Dian Fossey Gorilla Fund for the last 30 years. She has also served on the Board of Human Rights First for 25 years, and is currently a Trustee on the Board of the New York Botanical Garden. Weaver was proud to receive the National Audubon Society's Rachel Carson Award in 2009 for her environmental work. She is also a co-founder of The Flea Theater in Lower Manhattan, which champions young artists and new work.

CHRIS MESSINA ('WILL')

Chris Messina can most recently be seen opposite Rosamund Pike in the Netflix feature I CARE A LOT, which premiered at TIFF 2020 and was one of Netflix's most viewed original titles of this year. Messina also recently appeared in the indie SHE DIES TOMORROW, directed by Amy Seimetz, and in the third season of the critically acclaimed USA anthology series THE SINNER with Matt Bomer & Bill Pullman. Elsewhere in the feature space, he stars opposite Margot Robbie & Ewan McGregor in the Warner Bros. film BIRDS OF PREY. He recently wrapped the independent feature CALL JANE, which will premiere at Sundance 2022, directed by Oscar-nominee Phyllis Nagy, opposite Sigourney Weaver & Elizabeth Banks, and a role opposite Julia Roberts & Sean Penn in the upcoming Starz limited series GASLIT. He also filmed the indie DREAMIN' WILD, directed by Bill Pohlad, with Casey Affleck, Beau Bridges, & Noah Jupe, and ISS, directed by Gabriela Cowperthwaite.

Previously, Messina played "Detective Richard Willis" in Jean-Marc Vallée's HBO Emmy-nominated limited series SHARP OBJECTS opposite Amy Adams and prior, he spent six years alongside Mindy Kaling in THE MINDY PROJECT. Additional credits include LIVE BY NIGHT opposite Ben Affleck, Gia Coppola's PALO ALTO, David Gordon Green's MANGLEHORN with Al Pacino and ARGO, which won the Academy Award for Best Picture in 2012. He also starred with Glenn Close & Rose Bryne in DAMAGES for FX. In 2003, Messina made his Broadway debut in Oscar Wilde's SALOME at the Ethel Barrymore Theater.

KATE MARA ('LANA')

Kate Mara was born and raised in Bedford, New York. She began acting at age fourteen in local theater projects. At fifteen Kate made her feature film debut in *Random Hearts* for director Sydney Pollack.

Kate's impressive list of film credits include *Brokeback Mountain* for director Ang Lee in which she portrayed Heath Ledger's daughter; *Transsiberian* with Sir Ben Kingsley and Woody Harrelson for director Brad Anderson; *We Are Marshall*

with Matthew McConaughey and Matthew Fox for director McG; *Shooter* with Mark Wahlberg for director Antoine Fuqua and *Stone of Destiny* with Charlie Cox for director Charles Martin Smith.

Kate also appeared in the Academy Award® nominated film 127 Hours with James Franco and Amber Tamblyn for director Danny Boyle. She co-starred in *Transcendence* alongside Johnny Depp, Paul Bettany, Rebecca Hall and Morgan Freeman, which marked the directorial debut of Academy Award-winning cinematographer, Wally Pfister.

In 2015 Kate starred in three films. First audiences saw her as 'Sue Storm' in the Fox film *Fantastic Four* alongside Miles Teller and Michael B. Jordan. Then she starred in *Captive* alongside David Oyelowo, where she portrayed a single mother struggling with a meth addiction in the adaptation of the best-selling book <u>An Unlikely Angel</u>. Kate also starred in director Ridley Scott's outer space action film *The Martian* alongside Matt Damon and Jessica Chastain. The film received seven Academy Awards® nominations.

In 2016, Kate starred in the sci-fi thriller *Morgan* for director Luke Scott which was released by Twentieth Century Fox and in the psychological thriller *Man Down* in which she portrayed 'Natalie Drummer,' wife of war veteran 'Gabriel Drummer,' played by Shia LaBeouf.

Most recently, audiences saw Kate star in John Curran's thriller *Chappaquiddick* in which she played 'Mary Jo Kopechne' alongside Jason Clarke and Ed Helms and *Megan Leavey* which is the true story of Marine Corporal Megan Leavey, who forms a powerful bond with an aggressive combat dog, Rex. Kate also produced and starred opposite Ellen Page in Tali Shalom-Ezer's film *Mercy*.

Upcoming, Kate will star in the women's rights drama *Call Jane*, alongside Elizabeth Banks and Sigourney Weaver for director Phyllis Nagy.

On the small screen, Kate most recently starred, and executive produced the FX limited series, "A Teacher" based on Hannah Fidell's 2013 film. Fidell penned, directed and executive produced the series. The show was nominated for "Best New Scripted Series" at the 36th Annual Film Independent Spirit Awards. Mara was individually nominated as part of the producing team.

Upcoming, Kate will lead *Class of '09*, a drama limited series for FX on Hulu alongside Brian Tyree Henry. The drama follows a class of FBI agents operating in a near-future world where the U.S. criminal justice system has been transformed by artificial intelligence

In 2018, Mara was seen starring in FX's "Pose." Set in the 1980s, the Ryan Murphy produced series looks at the juxtaposition of several segments of life and society in New York.

Kate received an Emmy Award® nomination for her role in David Fincher's critically acclaimed television series, *House of Cards* in which she co-starred alongside Kevin Spacey and Robin Wright.

Kate also portrayed a mentally unstable ghost alongside Jessica Lange in Season One of Ryan Murphy's critically acclaimed series *American Horror Story* for FX.

WUNMI MOSAKU ('GWEN')

BAFTA award-winning actress Wunmi Mosaku has established herself as an international acting presence on the rise.

Upcoming, Wunmi will star in women's rights drama CALL JANE opposite Elizabveth Banks and Sigourney Weaver. The film, which is directed by screenwriter Phyllis Nagy and based on The Blacklist script by Hayley Schore and Roshan Sethi, will make its world premiere at the 2022 Sundance Film Festival. In 2022, Wunmi will also be seen in the Lionsgate film, ALICE DARLING, opposite Anna Kendrick. ALICE DARLING will mark the directorial debut of Mary Nighy.

Wunmi can most recently be seen in Marvel's LOKI for Disney+, alongside Tom Hiddleston, Owen Wilson and Gugu Mbatha-Raw. LOKI follows the titular character 'Loki' (Hiddleson) who is brought to the mysterious Time Variance

Authority organization after stealing the Tesseract during the events of AVENGERS: ENDGAME. He travels through time altering human history, ending up trapped in his own crime thriller. The series released in early summer of 2021 and has since garnered rave reviews in addition to being picked up for a second season.

Further on television, Wunmi will also star in the upcoming HBO miniseries WE OWN THIS CITY, from THE WIRE's EP David Simon and producer George Pelecanos. Wunmi will appear alongside Jon Bernthal, and Josh Charles. The series is based on Baltimore Sun reporter Justin Fenton's book We Own This City: A True Story of Crime, Cops and Corruption. As production just recently concluded, a release date has yet to be set.

In 2020, Wunmi appeared in JJ Abrams's critically acclaimed HBO series LOVECRAFT COUNTRY. Based on the novel of the same name, the series explores the juxtaposition between the horror fiction of HP Lovecraft and the struggle and survival to overcome racism in 1950s Jim Crow America. Since its premiere, critics have lauded Wunmi's standout performance of 'Ruby Baptiste' as "magnificent" and "powerful." The series has been nominated for a Primetime Emmy Award in the category of Outstanding Drama Series, a Golden Globe Award in the category of Best Television Series – Drama and a SAG Award in the category of Outstanding Performance by an Ensemble in a Drama Series. For her role as 'Ruby," Wunmi has also been nominated individually for a Critics Choice Super Award in the category of Best Actress in a Horror Series and a Critics Choice TV Award in the category of Best Supporting Actress in a Drama Series.

That same year, Wunmi starred as the lead in the New Regency/BBC Films HIS HOUSE, opposite Sope Dirisu. Directed by Remi Weekes, the film follows refugee couple Bol (Dirisu) and Rial (Mosaku) who make a harrowing escape from war-torn South Sudan, but struggle to adjust to their new life in an English town that has an evil lurking beneath the surface. The film, which premiered at the 2020 Sundance Film Festival to rave reviews, was acquired by Netflix and released on the platform on October 30, 2020. For her role, Wunmi was awarded a British Independent Film Award in the category of Best Performance by an Actressand was also nominated for a 2021 BAFTA award in the category of Best Actress in a Leading Role. The film has also been nominated for a number of awards, including Best British Independent Filmat the 2021 British Independent Film Awards and Outstanding International Motion Pictureat the 2021 NAACP Awards.

In 2019, Wunmi starred opposite Idris Elba in the fifth season of the Emmy-nominated crime drama LUTHER and in 2016, Wunmi played the lead role of 'Gloria Taylor' in the award-winning television drama DAMILOLA, OUR LOVED BOY. She went on to win her first BAFTA TV award for this role in the category of Best Supporting Actress and was highly praised at the time of release, with The Telegraphsaying "Wunmi Mosaku...was superb."

Wunmi also appeared in the feature film SWEETNESS IN THE BELLY, a powerful love story based on the bestselling novel by Camilla Gibb alongside Dakota Fanning – in which The Hollywood Reporter cited Wunmi's portrayal as "luminous." Additionally, Wunmi appeared in Hector Dockrill's GOLDFISH, which was nominated for a BAFTA award in the category of Best British Short Film in 2020. In 2010, Wunmi was named one of "The Seven Fresh Faces of Toronto International Film Festival" for her role in the BAFTA award nominated film I AM SLAVE. She played 'Malia,' a girl who has been kidnapped from her village in Sudan and sold into slavery. The Hollywood Reporter called her performance "heart-wrenching"; The Telegraphsaid Mosaku "rose to the challenge with a performance of incredible maturity. Her fear and vulnerability were deeply affecting and tangible throughout." For this role, Wunmi won awards such asBest Actress at the Birmingham Black Film Festival, Best Onscreen Performance at the Cultural Diversity Awards and Best Female Performance at the Screen Nation Awards. Wunmi was also featured on the front cover of Screen International Magazine in 2009 as one of their prestigious 'Stars of Tomorrow' and in 2011 was featured in Nylon Magazine's 2011 Young Hollywood issue.

Other notable credits include David Yates and JK Rowling's blockbuster FANTASTIC BEASTS AND WHERE TO FIND THEM, Zack Snyder's BATMAN V SUPERMAN: DAWN OF JUSTICE opposite Amy Adams, Ben Affleck and Henry Cavill, Stephen Frear's Oscar-nominated PHILOMENA with Steve Coogan and Judi Dench, as well as the independent British features CITADEL and WOMB. On the small screen, Wunmi can be seen in TEMPLE opposite Mark Strong and Carice Van Houten, the BAFTA award nominated series' THROUGH THE GATES (ON THE EDGE), KIRI and THE END OF THE F***ING WORLD, GUERRILLA with Idris Elba, Rory Kinnear and Frida Pinto, Charlie Brooker's BLACK MIRROR, Euros Lyn's CAPITAL, the BAFTA award winning drama DON'T TAKE MY BABY, Dominic Mitchell's IN THE FLESH, the Golden Globe-nominated drama DANCING ON THE EDGE and MOSES JONES alongside Eamonn Walker and Shaun Parkes.

A RADA (Royal Academy of Dramatic Art) graduate, Wunmi made her onstage debut at the Arcola Theatre in a production of Pedro Calderón de la Barca's THE GREAT THEATRE OF THE WORLD. Since then, Wunmi has worked extensively in theatre; most recently in Vicky Featherstone's CYPRUS AVENUE at the Abbey, Dublin and Royal Court, Nina Raine's TIGER COUNTRY at Hampstead Theatre, Robert Icke's MR. BURNS at the Almeida and Rupert Goold's ROUGH CROSSINGS.

Born in Nigeria and raised in the UK, Wunmi currently resides in Los Angeles.

CORY MICHAEL SMITH ('DEAN')

Cory Michael Smith recently starred in Gillian Flynn's series UTOPIA for Amazon. He earned Critics Choice and Gold Derby nominations for his appearance opposite Frances McDormand in the award-winning HBO Miniseries OLIVE KITTERIDGE, and is well-known for having played 'The Riddler' on the hit Fox series GOTHAM for 5 seasons. His film credits include Todd Haynes' films CAROL and WONDERSTRUCK, Damien Chazelle's FIRST MAN, Yen Tan's poignant film, 1985, which he also produced, Peter Hedges THE SAME STORY, and, most recently, Phyllis Nagy's CALL JANE opposite Sigourney Weaver and Elizabeth Banks.

On stage, he made his Broadway debut starring opposite Emilia Clarke in Truman Capote's "Breakfast at Tiffany's". He starred Off-Broadway in the U.S. premiere of "Cock aka The Cockfight Play" by Mike Bartlett and in the New York premiere of "The Whale" by Samuel D. Hunter. Prior to that, he was seen in the New York premiere of "The Shaggs: Philosophy of the World" produced by Playwrights Horizons and New York Theatre Workshop.

GRACE EDWARDS ('CHARLOTTE')

Grace Edwards stars as the lead in Amazon Prime's MODERN LOVE, opposite Lulu Wilson in the episode entitled "Am I?...Maybe this Quiz Will Tell Me", directed by Celine Held & Logan George. She can next be seen as one of the leads of Phyllis Nagy's CALL JANE opposite Elizabeth Banks and Sigourney Weaver and just wrapped shooting the new Wes Anderson film ASTEROID CITY, opposite Scarlett Johansson. In the past, she's appeared on AMERICAN CRIME STORY: IMPEACHEMENT on FX opposite Billy Eichner, the USA drama SUITS, and had a recurring role on ABC's SCHOOLED.

JOHN MAGARO ('DETECTIVE CHILMARK')

John Magaro has spent his career nurturing an impressive body of work that encompasses film, television, and theatre.

Magaro starred as 'Otis "Cookie" Figowitz' in FIRST COW, directed by Kelly Reichardt, with a screenplay written by Reichardt and Jonathan Raymond. The film, which had its world premiere at the 2019 Telluride Film Festival, and was selected to compete at the 70th Berlin International Film Festival, was released by A24 in the US on March 6, 2020 and subsequently, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, was released via VOD on July 10, 2020. FIRST COW was selected as the Best Film at the 2020 New York Film Critics Circle Awards, and it was named one of the 10 Best Films of 2020 by the National Board of Review. On behalf of his performance in the film, Magaro was nominated for a 2020 Gotham Award.
